ABOUT THE GERIATRIC SPECIALTY PROGRAM



NHA's Geriatric Specialty Program is a field-based program providing mental health services to adults 60 years and older who reside in the Central San Diego area and neighboring communities. The focus of the program is to reach out and provide support to at-risk seniors who are unable or unwilling to seek assistance from other mental health settings. There is no charge for services. Our goal is to help seniors be safe, continue to stay in their own homes and have a good quality of life.

The Geriatric Specialty Program is a component of NHA's Project Enable, a Wellness and Recovery Center.

ELIGIBILITY

Clients of The Geriatric Specialty Program must be:

- *60 years of age or older*
- *At risk and/or isolated, homebound, in crisis or generally experiencing one or more of the following symptoms: Trouble coping with daily activities; increased forgetfulness and confusion; feelings of sadness, depression or anxiety; unexplained aches or pains; sudden changes in eating and sleeping patterns; or changes in social interactions such as pulling away from people or a loss of interest in pleasurable activities.*

SERVICES

- *In-home mental health screening & assessments*
- *Short-term wellness support provided by Registered Nurse and Licensed Clinician*
- *Comprehensive referrals to support community-based living*
- *Community outreach & education*
