Basic Job Assignment:

Under general direction, to provide training and technical assistance on nutrition services and standards to Early Head Start/Head Start programs served by Neighborhood House Association; to consult with parents of children with nutrition needs and concerns, to ensure that enrolled children have necessary nutrition services; to plan and implement nutrition services; to assist with program performance monitoring and evaluation; to collaborate with the Central Kitchen nutrition program; and to do related work as required.

Employment Requirements:

The ideal candidate is a self-motivated, independent worker who possesses a solid understanding of principles of nutrition, including food science, child nutrition and diet therapy; USDA requirements for child care food programs; Early Head Start/Head Start and NHA programs; principles of supervision; children with special health and developmental concerns, professional development and training; counseling techniques; the ability to maintain sensitive and confidential information; communicate effectively orally and in writing with staff, managers, clients/participants, and individuals of varying levels outside of the department and organization using tact, discretion and diplomacy; establish and maintain effective working relationships with all levels of able to plan and prepare in a thorough fashion; correct English usage, including spelling, grammar and punctuation; and has demonstrated experience working with culturally and ethnically diverse, low income clients and unique populations.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree in nutrition or a related field <u>AND</u> possession of a valid certificate as a Registered Dietitian issued by the Commission on Dietetic Registration is required;
- At least five (5) years of work experience in a nutrition-related field, including experience in supporting nutrition needs and challenges of young children (ages 0-5 years) and their families.
- Experience working with young children with health and development concerns is desired;
- At least one year of experience in a supervisory role;
- Possession of, or ability to obtain, a valid Class C Driver's License is required with a good driving record of at least two (2) years duration, as evidenced by freedom from multiple or serious traffic violations or accidents, is required;
- Must meet and maintain State law and County licensing requirements regarding employment in a childcare center (Fingerprints, TB and Physical).



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Example of Major Functions:

- Develop and implement nutrition programs which meet the needs of young children and their families;
- Consult with parents of children with nutrition concerns, including children with specialized developmental and health needs
- Provide training programs and workshops for parents and Early Head Start/Head Start staff;
- Promote parent engagement with Early Head Start/Head Start nutrition programs;
- Ensure program compliance with food regulations and standards;
- Maintain records and prepare reports;
- Develops plans, procedures and policies to ensure nutrition-related Head Start Performance Standards are met;
- Monitors Early Head Start/Head Start Program for compliance with all nutrition standards;
- Participates in overall planning and management of the Nutrition content;
- Consults with parents and caregivers with regard to nutrition-related matters;
- Collaborates with community partners to remain current on community-related nutrition concerns;
- Monitors meal services for compliance with Federal and State regulations regarding type, service size, and timing; monitors Head Start facilities for proper storage, handling, preparation, delivery, and serving of food;
- Conducts food planning workshops; reviews and approves documentation of eligibility for receiving food service;
- Assess the nutritional status of children in Early Head Start/Head Start programs;
- Consults with the Central Kitchen Director regarding special diets for children with allergies and/or medical needs;
