#### **Basic Job Assignment:**

Under the supervision of the BIH Program Director, provides on-site supervision to children ages 18 months to 12 years while parents attend prenatal, postpartum and/or other BIH related group activities.

#### **Employment Requirements:**

The ideal candidate is a self-motivated, independent worker who possesses an adequate understanding of appropriate child development theories and practices; The ideal candidate will also have the ability to communicate effectively with staff, participants, and individuals of varying levels; establish and maintain effective working relationships with employees, parents, and others encountered in the course of work; create and maintain a safe learning environment for children and others; be sensitive to the needs of small children and culturally and ethnically diverse groups; Communicate effectively orally and in writing; Operate standard office equipment. In addition, the candidate should be approachable and a team player, and has demonstrated experience working and effectively communicating with culturally and ethnically diverse, low income or no income clients and unique populations.

#### **Qualifications:**

- High school diploma or equivalent required; **AND**
- A minimum of six (6) units of Child Development or Early Childhood Education (with a grade of 'C' or better) from an accredited college /university **OR**
- A minimum of four (4) of ROP Training in a Child Development Program; **PLUS**
- At least one (1) year of experience working as child care aide, teacher aide or higher position;
- Current Certification in pediatric first aid and CPR or the ability to obtain within 90 days of employment;
- Must meet and maintain state law and county licensing requirements regarding employment in a child care center (fingerprints, TB, physical).



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### **Example of Major Functions:**

- Sets up child care room prior to arrival of children;
- Assists in developing and maintaining a safe environment for the children;
- Ensures that children engage in age-appropriate activities/play (including watching of movies or videos);
- Provides emotional and physical support as appropriate to children and encourages high self-esteem;
- Escorts children who are toilet trained to restroom and may change diapers for other children as needed;
- Supervises snack-time (food to be provided by BIH program or child's parent);
- Cleans up child care room at the conclusion of child care assignment;
